Avoid photographing the car/license plate of the individual, unless you inform them why you are doing it. Otherwise, a misinterpretation such as personal harassment, or racial profiling could occur.

The Board would like take this opportunity to thank the members of the community for their volunteerism, support and cooperation during 2018. A special "thank you" goes to those members of the community that served on a committee; your hours of service make the Board's work more manageable.
